### BETTER SERVICE ON S. P. IF NEEDED

An investigation of the train service now being given by the Southern Pacific company on its main line between Portland and Ashland has been made by the Oregon railroad commission, and it has been found that good grounds exist for the complaints of the people that the service is inadequate and un-

notice upon the company that a hearing will be had, at which it will be determined what reasonable and adequate service shall be given. The main cause of complaints is the company's recent arbitrary canceling of two daily trains on this run, when travel was more than could be taken care of by the existing service. The commission will set an early date for the hearing, and prompt action will be taken to relieve the situation that southern Oregon people are forced to meet only a short time before the Christmas holidays, when they would most highly appreciate the best possible facilities for railroad travel and mail transmission. Commissioners Campbell and West, in their preliminary findings said: "For a number of years prior to November 16, 1907, the Southern Pacific company operated three passenger trains

each way daily between Portland, Oregon, and San Francisco, California—those towards San Francisco being known as Nos. 11, 12 and 13 and those towards Portland being known as Nos. 12, 14 and 16. "Since November 10, 1907, the company has refused to operate trains Nos. 11 and 12, except between Portland, Oregon, and Roseburg, Oregon, thereby depriving the patrons of the road between Roseburg, Oregon, and Ashland, Oregon, of a service they have enjoyed for years, causing them great inconvenience and loss of time, and demoralizing the rail service. "After due hearing and investigation, if the said commission shall find the aforesaid service to be unreasonable and inadequate, an order will be made as provided by said chapter 83 of the laws of Oregon for the year 1907, prescribing a reasonable and adequate service."

### GOLDFIELD MAY MINT OWN COIN

(United Press Lensed Wire.) Goldfield, Nev., Nov. 21.—If a plan now under consideration by W. E. Dowlen, manager of the Nevada Goldfield Reduction works, is consummated, Goldfield will soon have a circulating medium which will relieve to a great extent the scarcity of real money with

which the camp is afflicted. The plan is to take the bullion produced by the mills, make it into bars and stamp thereon the value, which will be used as money. The question of the legality of the plan and its possible conflict with the currency laws of the land is now being investigated. At present the three reduction works of the camp—the Nevada Goldfield, the Combination and Kinkaid mills—are turning out about \$5,000 a day, but this amount could easily be quadrupled by running on ores of a higher grade. At the rate of \$20,000 a day the camp could produce \$80,000 a month in gold. James R. Davis of the Round Mountain Mining company has agreed to put the bullion from that mill into circulation in the same way, providing the plan is found to be feasible, which

would add from \$30,000 to \$50,000 a month to the amount available. **FIVE CHILDREN ARE BURNED TO DEATH** (United Press Lensed Wire.)
