

HEAR EXPLOSION AT SEA IN NIGHT

Crew of French Ship Europe Startled by a Strange Phenomenon.

MIGHT HAVE BEEN METEOR, SAYS CAPTAIN

Disturbance Occurred at About Same Time Crew of French Bark Crillon Saw Meteor and When Tidal Wave Swept Norwegian Steamer.

On November 2, the same day that the Norwegian steamer Admiral Borge was swept by a tidal wave and nearly wrecked in mid-ocean, those on board the French ship Europe were frightened by a peculiar noise resembling a distant but tremendous explosion. The ship was off the California coast in the latitude of San Francisco and sailing north for the Columbia River.

The Europe arrived up in the Portland harbor yesterday afternoon and berthed at Columbia dock to discharge a cargo of cement from San Francisco. In her fifth visit here, Captain Boller was met at the dock by a large delegation of friends to whom he related the strange phenomenon experienced about two weeks before reaching the mouth of the river.

"We were proceeding along nicely," said the skipper, "when about midnight we heard a strange sound much like a skyrocket. A moment later it was followed by the rumbling of a muffled explosion. We saw nothing in the sky that led to the belief that a meteor had swept by, although I am told that a meteor was seen that same night from the French bark Crillon, which was somewhere in the same vicinity."

The experiences of Admiral Borge and the time are looked upon as indicative of a great upheaval of the ocean bed having occurred about that time somewhere between this coast and the Hawaiian Islands. Further light is expected to be thrown on the matter with the arrival soon of other vessels that might have been similarly affected.

The Admiral Borge, as reported in dispatches, put into Honolulu a couple of days ago with her deck load of lumber, masts and funnels swept from the deck. She was bound from Portland for the Orient.

The Europe came out by way of Cape of Good Hope and Hobart town, Tasmania. In July several immense icebergs were sighted a few hundred miles to the southward of the island of Madagascar, much to the surprise of the sailors, since it was not the usual course of the moving ice from the Antarctic.

In the middle of the Indian ocean the Europe fell into a calm that delayed her about two weeks. She made but 200 miles in 15 days, a distance covered in 24 hours with an ordinary fair breeze. The run from Hobart town to the Columbia was uneventful except for a strong blow off the mouth of the Columbia.

LARGE SILK SHIPMENT.

Oriental Liner Numantia Due Here Monday From Hongkong.

Two freight cars are in waiting at Montgomery dock when the Portland & Asiatic liner Numantia arrives from Hongkong and will immediately be sent into the hold to dig out bales of raw silk to the value of \$150,000 that are destined for New York, and estimated enough to fill the two cars.

The object in rushing the silk across the continent is to save interest on the money tied up. At 8 per cent the interest on the comparatively small bulk amounts to more than \$30 a day.

so it will be seen that a delay of three days would mean no small item. The fact that the shipment is being made by way of Portland goes to show that time can be saved by this route even though the liners are not as fast as some plying between the Orient and other Pacific coast ports.

The Numantia will hardly be able to get away before December 1 on her return voyage.

GALE BLOWING AT SEA.

Steamer President Sends Message From Umatilla Reef.

While the storm is believed to have abated locally a heavy gale is still making things unpleasant at sea. This morning the steamer President, which at that time was riding out the storm off Umatilla lightship near Cape Flattery.

The message states that the weather is cloudy and that a south gale is raging. The barometer at 29.60 and the wind is blowing from the North. The vessel is in a position to be blown off the coast and is likely to be driven along the coast and, already this morning the wind attained a velocity of 24 miles an hour. No report was received from Tatoosh, which is further evidence of severe storms raging at the entrance to the Straits of Juan de Fuca. Storm warnings were displayed last night at all the coast ports.

WINDJAMMERS COMING.

Miltonburn, Thiers and Wavertree to Carry Away Grain.

The British ship Miltonburn will arrive in this harbor this afternoon in ballast to load wheat for Europe. The ship left yesterday morning in tow of one of the O. R. & N. boats. The vessel will probably remain at anchor in the stream until a berth can be secured at one of the ballast docks.

The French bark Thiers started up the river this morning but the wind on the bay off Astoria was so strong that the tugboat had to let her go and they will probably not start up until tomorrow, when it is hoped the strong wind will have abated.

The British ship Wavertree will be in the harbor in a couple of days to load wheat for Europe. She has been at Astoria since the first part of the week and was chartered shortly after her arrival by the Northwestern Warehouse company.

COMING FOR CARGOES.

Steamers Sungari and Persia Booked for Orient.

The Russian steamer Sungari is reported coming here from Quivanas, Mexico, to load wheat, flour and lumber for the Orient. She is a good-sized carrier with capacity for about 5,000 tons. The American steamer Persia, which was chartered several days ago by the Portland & Asiatic Steamship company to carry flour and general cargo from this port to the Orient is expected to arrive here between the first and tenth of next month. She will carry about 3,000 tons, and most of the space has been reserved.

ALONG THE WATERFRONT.

The steamer Alliance, Captain Olson, from Coos bay, will be at Couch street dock late this evening.

The steam schooner Johan Poulsen, Captain Nelson, arrived at Astoria this morning and will be at Pine street late this evening. She will load wheat and lumber for a return cargo for San Francisco.

The Harriman liner Senator is due to arrive here late this evening from San Francisco. She is booked to depart Monday afternoon. The City of Panama is due to arrive here Monday as an extra freighter and the intention is to have her leave on Wednesday.

The steam schooner Aurelia arrived at the mill of the Portland Lumber company this morning to load lumber for San Francisco in place of the steamer Excelsior which is still at the bay city undergoing repairs. J. Jeffers, a longshoreman belonging to union No. 245, got in the way of a wheat sack shooting the chute on the British steamer Queen Louise yesterday afternoon and today he is at St. Vincent's hospital with a broken leg. The Queen Louise is loading at Oceanic dock this morning, but she will probably not be lifted until next Monday.
