#### WEATHER REPORT

A large high pressure area overlies the Rocky mountain states and a mod-crate disturbance is central over New England. Light snow has fallen in the Inversion and Light show has fallen in the lower lake region, middle Atlantic and the United States fair weather prevails. Light frosts occurred this morning in California as far south as San Luis Obispo. The temperatures along the east slope of the Rocky mountains are dirbitly above normal, and it is also slightly above normal, and it is also slightly warmer than usual in the Wil-lamette valley, extreme southern Call-fornia and southern Arizona. Over the remainder of the United States the temperatures are below normal, and in the Gulf, south Atlantic and New England

states it is much colder than usual. The indications are for fair weather in this district Tuesday except in west-ern Washington and along the coast in northern Oregon, where rain is proba-
