The general register of the Merchant Navies of All Countries, published by the Bureau Veritas, records the number of sating ships of 50 tons and over classified by the bureau as 25,879, with a net tonnage of 7,245,608, against 26,579, with a net tonnage of 7,559,273 a year ago. Following is a table of sailing ship net tonnage for the present year: Great Britain, 1,682,000; United States, 1,462,000; Norway, 702,000; Russia, 564,000; France, 521,000; Italy, 473,000; Germany, 444,000; Sweden, 248,000; Turkey, 186,000, Japan, 168,000.

Between the years 1895 and 1907, the world's steam tonnage has almost doubled, while the sailing fleets have decreased by 19 per cent. The increase

in the steam tonnage in the past 12 months amounts to 329 vessels, of 1.087,475 tons net.
