SILETZ LAND FAST PASSING TO PATENT

Loose Procedure of Former Days Relegated and the Claimants Must Now Make Good.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)

Newport, Or., Dec. 21.—The Siletz Indian reservation, opened by special act of congress in 1906, is fast going to patent. It has been estimated that fully 75 per cent of the claims will be owned by the settlers within the coming year. In some cases claims have changed hands as much as six times, either by relinquishment, contest or cancellation on account of not fulfilling the requirements of the homestead laws. Some settlers visit their claims but once in six months and their only visible improvement was a so-called cabin constructed of logs and with boughs of trees for roofs and without windows or door.

For change has come and the settlers of today perfectly adapted to the law or losing their claims.

The reservation comprises an area of 25 miles square, nearly all in Lincoln county. It contains a vast body of growth timber, consisting of fir, spruce, hemlock and cedar. Many claims have 25,000 feet to the quarter section, and offer to the lumberman a quantity and variety of timber that perhaps cannot be excelled elsewhere on the Pacific coast. It is assured that the day is not far distant when logging will be carried on in earnest, and as fast as the timber is removed it will be replaced for darning and fruit culture which have already been demonstrated in this section, both climate and soil proving perfectly adapted.

The principal stream is the Siletz river, having a resemblance to the Mohawk in New York. In times past it was the only means of communication for the Indians. It is navigable for 30 miles from its mouth, admitting light draft boats.

LEAN CHRISTMAS FOR STOCK EXCHANGE

(United Press Leased Wire.)

New York, Dec. 21.—Christmas among the brokerage houses in the financial district this season is expected to be even a leaner year in the matter of bonuses to employes than last, which fell far below the fat times of 1904 and 1905.

For all that, however, the committee on the Consolidated Exchange, which has in charge the matter of collecting the annual gratuity for employes has been recently more liberal in return than were generally expected. Since the exchange moved into its new building last summer the members have prospered and as a result something like \$2,000 will be distributed as Christmas gifts among its employes.

Among the large banking and brokerage houses it is not expected that the wallets of the employes will be greatly fattened with Christmas bonuses. Some of the members are, however, in former years have received presents of thousand dollar bills as a matter of courtesy, but this year it is expected as pleased if they receive presents of a quarter of that amount at the distribution this year.
