SKETCHES OF PORTLAND PASTORS.

James Dimond Corby was born in Brooklyn, New York, and received his early education in the public schools of that city. Entering business life at an early age, he received a practical training in commercial methods in the leading wholesale dry goods houses of the metropolis and then became a partner by several years in Wall street as secretary to one of the active operators.

He worked his way through Clinton Liberal Institute, where he entered and entered Saint Lawrence university at Canton, New York, graduating with honor in the class of 1892. His executive ability was early utilized by the "Empire State" of the Empire state who chose him secretary of the Universalist state convention held at the Hotel Madison in 1893.

He has held various pastorates at Troy, Hudson and Utica, New York. In these cities he was known far beyond denominational lines and was a welcome preacher in churches of all denominations. In Utica he was vice-president of the city ministerial association and outside of his preaching parish duties made time to be active in the work of procuring public playgrounds for children.

His various pastorates have been active in church extension work and since coming to Portland at the request of the missionary board of the Universalist church of this city, he has shown the effect of an aggressive leadership in the many improvements wrought, as well as the increase in the membership. More than double the number of families are enrolled than a year ago and a 50 per cent increase in the Sunday school.
