

POST ON CONVENTION

Republican Leaders Invite Chairman Westgate to Get Out of the Way When He Declines to Issue Call Look for Man.

George A. Westgate, chairman of the Republican state central committee, has refused to call a state convention for the nomination of a state Republican ticket for the election of June next and because of this refusal is now being urged to resign his office in order that another man more in harmony with the plans of the promoters of the scheme may be given the place.

The plan of these gentlemen is widespread and outlines a sweeping return to the old convention system of selecting candidates for office. It is being carried out by the various county conventions to fill up the county tickets with "indigenous" candidates, as well as the selection of a state Republican ticket for the June election.

STATE TO ARGUE PETTIBONE CASE

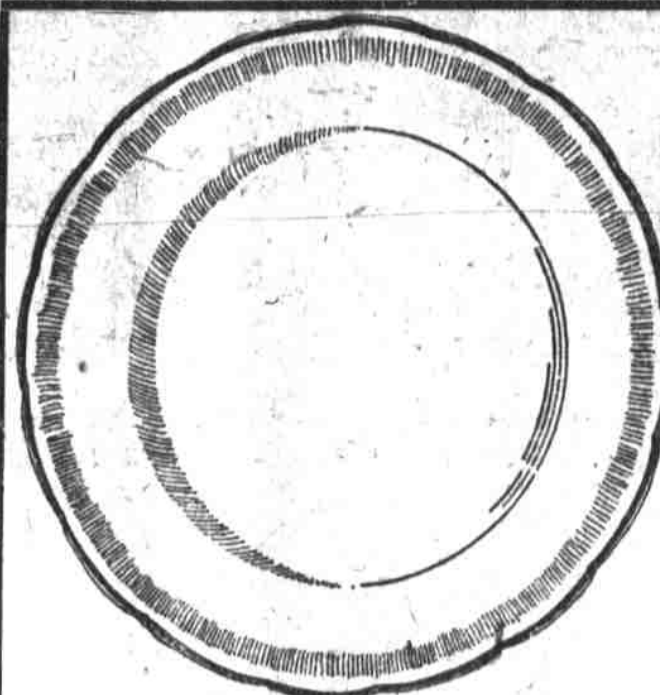
Defense Does Not Intend to Make Argument but May Change Course Later.
