Motions to Quash Indictments Brought Against Officials of Wrecked Bank - Attack on Informations Is Technical.

A technical attack on the informations filed against the accused officials of the Title Guaranty & Trust company was begun by the attorneys for the defendants this morning, when motions to quash and dismiss the informations were filed in the circuit court.

The presence of Martin L. Pipes during the examination of witnesses by the district attorney is one of the things objected to. Pipes was employed by District Attorney Manning to assist in the prosecution of the Title Guaranty company, but it is charged that he was not a legally appointed deputy and not entitled to be present.

Another objection made in that State Treasurer Finch, Charles Rankin and various clerks and employees of the present and past receivers of the bank were examined by the district attorney in his investigation, sitting as a grand jury, but that the names of these witnesses have not been indorsed at the bottom of the informations.

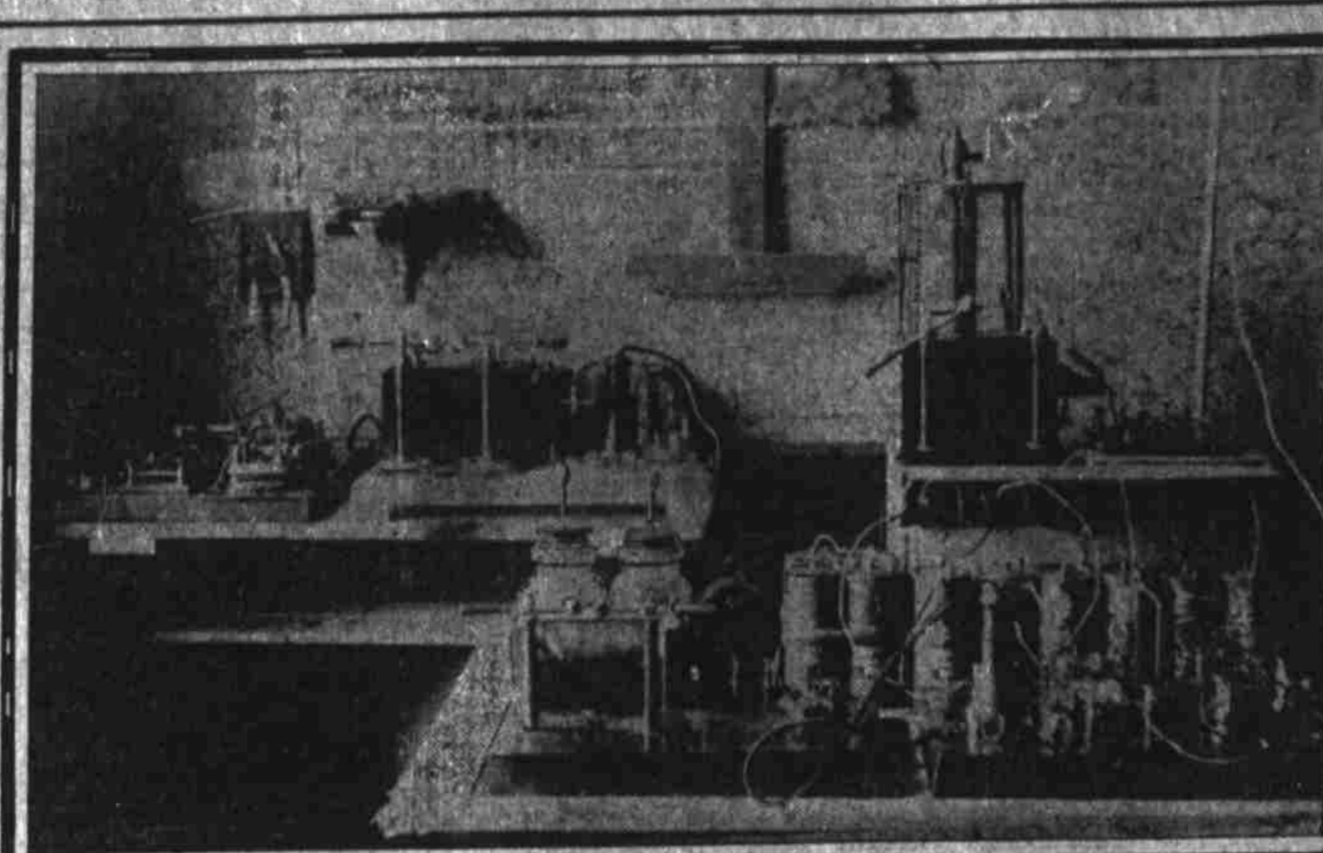
