The meeting is to be held in the hall of the New York State Progressive Democratic league, which was established to boom Mr. Bryan. Augustus Thomas, who is chairman of the league, declares that the meeting will be the most notable demonstration in honor of the Nebraska leader since the great meeting in Madison Square garden two years ago on Mr. Bryan's return from his trip around the world.

New York, Jan. 16.—Offering himself as a substitute to meet any fate which the jury may decide upon, whether it be the electric chair or imprisonment in Matthew asylum, an Ohio man has written to Evelyn Thaw, agreeing to take Harry Thaw's place for a consideration of \$3,000,000. The New York Globe prints this story today. The name of the man is being withheld. Accompanying the letter is a series of photographs of himself, showing that he strongly resembles the defendant in the defendant's cell, take the place of the prisoner and allow Thaw to walk out. The writer describes himself as a man of family, who has made a failure in life so far as the accumulation of money is concerned. He wants the \$3,000,000 for his family, not himself.
