DAVENPORT CAPTURES HIS AUDIENCE AT WHITE TEMPLE

Nine hundred and ninety-nine people bought seats at the White Temple last evening to hear Homer Davenport's lecture on the Arabian desert. The 999 began arriving early and by 8 o'clock not only the church and balcony were filled but the front seats in the Sunday school room and a number of persons were standing up. About 8 o'clock a little man brought in a glass and a pitcher of water and put it on the speaker's stand. The 999 brightened perceptibly and began looking anxiously towards the door from which the lecturer would make his entrance, but no Homer. After about 15 minutes the little man came in again carrying a toy hammer and some large sheets of white paper which he carefully tacked up on a sort of blackboard erected on the platform.
Again the 999 brightened but again were disappointed. After another 15 or 20 minutes wait Mr. Davenport was discovered in the Sunday school room shaking hands with friends. He very soon appeared on the platform accompanied by H. W. Scott, who introduced Mr. Davenport very briefly since, as he said, Mr. Davenport needed no introduction.
Unlike the usual lecturer Homer Davenport had discarded the usual dress suit the usual lecturer wears and appeared in a Prince Albert. Possibly, this was because the ordinary suit does not contain pockets and Mr. Davenport speaks most easily and naturally with his hands deep in his trouser's pockets. He takes his hands out only when he draws his cartoons.
Mr. Davenport is not a lecturer. He just stands up—with his hands in his pockets—and talks to his audience as if he were talking to a number of intimate friends. And since he is a most interesting talker and talks so easily and naturally—sort of conversationally as it were—he soon has every one in the audience feeling as if he were talking just to him or her, as the case may be, and even a stranger, who has never seen Mr. Davenport before, will leave the lecture or talk, feeling as if Mr. Davenport were a personal friend of his.
