STEAMER VISITS PITCAIRN ISLAND

Women Gradually Crowd Out Men in Strange Community.

CRAFT IN STORM OFF THE COLUMBIA Officers of the Saint Hugo Bring Interesting Tales From the South Sea—Big Tramp Loses Anchor Coming Up the River.

The British steamer Saint Hugo came near losing several members of her crew three months ago at Pitcairn island when it was brought to their attention that the community of interest colony in the South sea is gradually being transformed into a land of women only.

Officers of the Saint Hugo declare they were told by the leaders of the Bounty bay people that the men were gradually losing ground in numerical strength.

The Saint Hugo, which arrived here yesterday from Guaymas, Mexico, stopped two hours at Pitcairn on her way from Melendo to Sydney for a cargo of coal and did some trading with the people, who came out in small boats. The ruler, a man named Christian, told them that the population today consisted of 70 children, about 50 men and about twice that many women. Excepting that the women are gradually outnumbering the men, everything is serene on the isolated cliff made famous time after time by the landing of a crew of mutineers over 100 years ago.
