 The supposition is that the woman must have been passing herself off as a male attire for years and was known here as one of the stronger sex. The head and body of the woman is identified to such an extent that it is not likely that identification will ever be possible.

IDAHO TROOPS AT AMERICAN LAKE

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
 Boise, Idaho, Jan. 22—During the encampment of regular troops next summer at American lake, Washington, the Idaho National guard is authorized to participate from August 15 to 31. The guard of this state consists of one regiment of 12 companies, with a total strength of 530 men, which number, it is expected, will be materially increased before the coming encampment.
 The adjutant-general of Idaho has ordered the inspection of the 12 companies as follows: Colonel Charles A. Varnum, United States army, retired, having been detailed to make the inspec-

tions: Company G, Grangeville, January 21; H, Genesee, January 23; C, Couer d'Alene, January 25; E, Rathdrum, January 29; F, Blackfoot, February 5; K, Idaho Falls, February 10; M, Rexburg, February 13; D, St. Anthony, February 12; J, Cambridge, February 18; L, Weiser, February 20; I, Payette, February 22; A, Nampa, February 24. Examinations will also be held of all officers of the state guard.

INSURANCE COMPANY'S COLLAR FITS TOO TIGHT

New York Life Desires Policyholders to Help Modify Existing Laws.

That the life insurance interests of New York state intend to make a vigorous effort to have some modification in existing laws of the state passed at the present session of the legislature, is emphasized by the text of the advertisement which the New York Life Insurance company publishes in The Journal today.
 This advertisement is out of the common, in that it deals largely with ques-

tions of legislature, instead of with the usual dry facts and figures. It is addressed to the company's policyholders and tells them that as they succeeded two years ago in purifying life insurance through public opinion, so now, for their own protection, they must, in the same way, repeal and modify legislation. The policyholders are told that the reforms of two years ago were necessary, but that reforms discredited and endanger their own achievements when they write vicious amendments when they write vicious amendments into the statutes of the state.
 The advertisement calls for the modification or repeal of four sections of the New York state insurance laws, and probably foreshadows to some extent what the insurance companies desire.

Following directly upon the fight begun on the insurance laws at Albany this week, the statement of the New York Life Insurance company is especially interesting. The resolution of Assemblyman George M. Palmer, minority leader, asking for the appointment of a committee to investigate the Armstrong insurance laws appears to have been inspired by statistics presented by President Kingsley of the

New York Life Insurance company. These figures show a decrease of 50 per cent in the business of the principal life insurance companies in New York state.

 San Francisco, Jan. 22—The California club has begun an active campaign against impure milk. Mrs. Arthur W. Cornwall and Dr. Minor Kibbe, both members of the club's pure milk committee, accompanied by Dr. George McCall, personally invaded two large dairies on the south side of the city and made a thorough examination of their sanitary and health conditions. Cows were examined for signs of tuberculosis and the milkers' sleeping quarters underwent inspection.
 Tuberculosis, medical experts say, is claiming more victims every day and in impure milk and diseased meat, it is declared, the disease has its stronghold. With the children in mind, the California club has started its crusade against impure milk.
