### CHILDREN EAT POISONED BREAD

Four-Year-Old, Babes Find Food in Lot and Make a Feast on Rat Poison.

San Francisco, Jan. 23.—Two children, Flora Cobelli of 430 Green street and Angelina Arieta of 430 1/2 Green street, each 4 years of age, are near death as the result of eating bread that had been saturated in a strong solution of arsenic and thrown in a lot adjoining their homes.

The police are investigating the matter with a view to ascertaining who placed the poisoned bread within reach of the children. One report is to the effect that inspectors of the board of health employed in the work of exterminating rats in the district tossed the poisoned bread in the lot.
