

# TAMMANY TO REIGN IN WALLOWA

### New York Political Machine Quietly Lining Up to Secure Control of National House—Cochran Wants Speakership.

(United Press Lined Wire.)  
Washington, D. C., Jan. 24.—That Tammany is now engaged in playing one of the greatest games in the history of that organization, is the belief of politicians here. It embraces nothing less than the control of the next house of representatives. This will be a difficult task, but it is said that the campaign has been cunningly conceived, and already there are evidences that execution of the details has begun.

Tammany's braves have of late taken front rank among the Democrats of the shades of relative obscurity so quietly that John Sharp Williams, chief leader of the minority, and David de Armond, his rival didn't even see them do it.

To anyone who has been watching the progress of events, since the 10th congress opened it is apparent that Bourke Cochran, Tammany's peerless orator, now comes nearer being the real leader of the Democrats than any other member. His magnetic personality, his persuasive eloquence, and his political acumen have been drawing about him a constantly increasing group of influential fellow statesmen. Moreover, Cochran is the man who is raising up the Democratic text book for the coming congressional campaign.

As right bowler to Cochran, is Judge Goldfogle, a Tammanyite of high degree. Francis Burton Harrison has contributed appreciably to the increase of Tammany's influence in the house; and so have Charles Vincent Fornes, banker and insurance company director and John J. Fitzgerald, Brooklyn's star member. Representative William Sulzer, the Bowery boy, has been steadily growing in the estimation of his colleagues, and is expected to take a prominent part in the new Tammany game after he returns from his bridal tour.

Although the Democratic delegation from New York city is attracting more attention today than it ever has before in the lower branch of congress, those who have been keeping their eyes on Cochran are certain that his personal ambition is the speaker's chair for the next session. He increasingly predicts a Democratic majority in the house of the 61st congress. He has been reaching out for every Democratic vote in the house, and is not likely to stop until he has secured the speakership. He has been regenerated since his defection in 1896. His works in this congress he seeks abolition for all his past political sins in the next, he will ask for more substantial recognition.

## SUES MILLIONAIRE ON RAILROAD DEAL

### Barnes Says Chinese Coal Concessions Are Worth Very Large Sum.

New York, Jan. 24.—In upholding his contention that his services in procuring certain coal concessions for the Chinese railway syndicate were worth \$900,000, Thurlow Weed Barnes, grandson of Thurlow Weed, is giving testimony in the suit to recover that amount. Barnes claims that the concessions were procured along the line of the Pekin-Hankow railway in 1898 and he values such services at \$750,000 and other services at \$150,000. He said he got the concessions through Wu Tingfang, who was the Chinese ambassador at Washington. Such financiers as Pierpont Morgan, August Belmont, Jacob Schiff and L. P. Morton are interested in the syndicate which Barnes is suing.

## MISSING BANKER SAVED BY WIFE

### Mrs. Mathis Mortgages Her Home to Redeem Paper Liable to Be Forgery.

Bellingham, Wash., Jan. 24.—O. C. Mathis, missing president of the Exchange Bank of Blaine, is safe from prosecution for alleged forgery of \$3,000 worth of county school warrants, as the destruction and retention of these so-called securities will make proof of the supposed crime impossible. The warrants were placed by Mathis as collateral for a loan of \$1,000. Dr. Dun-black of Blaine, being the holder. An examination of the county's books after Mathis' flight is said to have discovered the fact that they were forgeries, but an effort to trace them and locate their present whereabouts failed until recently, when it became known in whose hands they had been placed as security.

An investigation today resulted in definitely ascertaining that by means of a mortgage on her home and real estate, Mrs. Mathis had, since her husband's disappearance, redeemed the paper and thus placed beyond reach of the prosecutors one piece of evidence of a nature believed to be criminal. It is thought that this step on the part of Mrs. Mathis will render probable her husband's return.

## NEWSPAPER DEAL AT SALT LAKE
