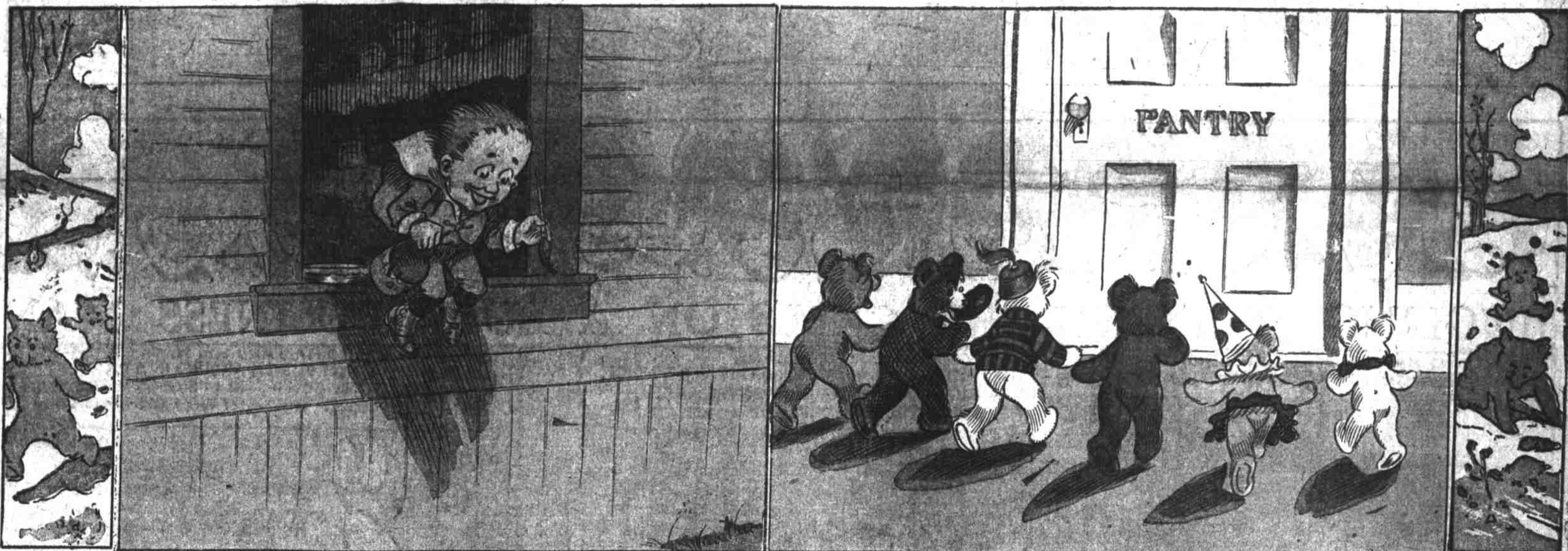

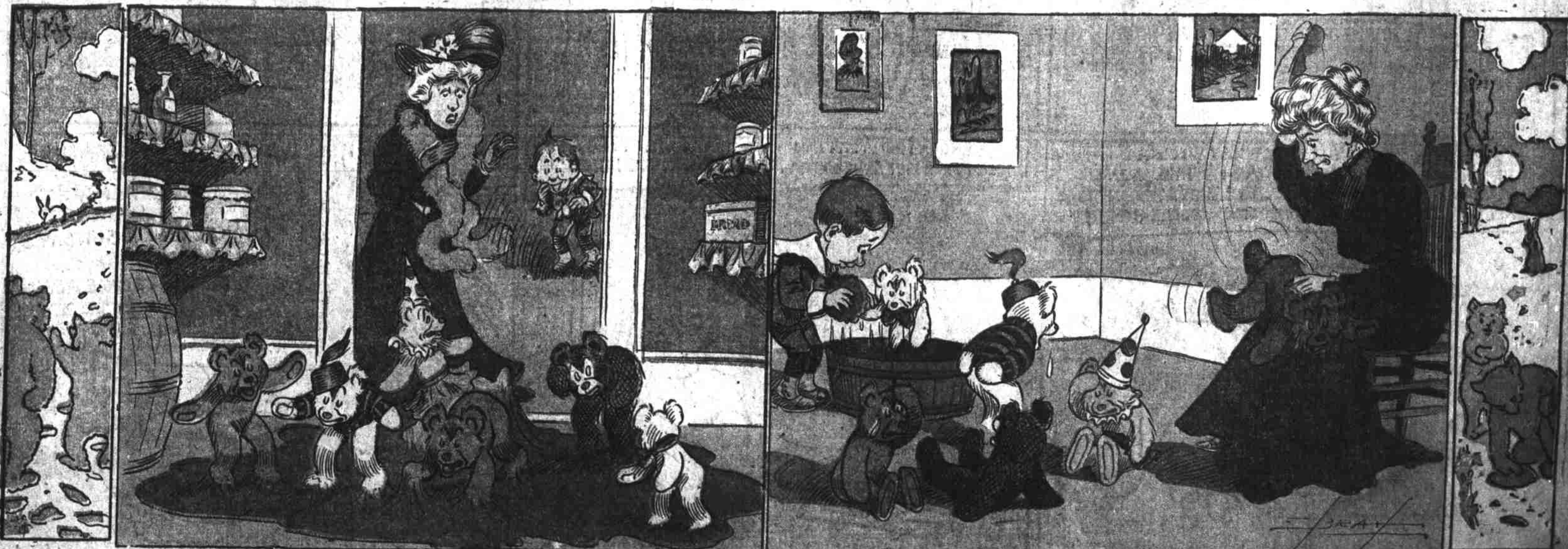
1. Most any boy will know that pies
