

ADAMS POLICE MAN BEATEN IN STREET WITHOUT OFFERING RESISTANCE

Robert M. Berry and Harrison G. O. Colby on the Retired List.

Washington, Jan. 28.—Seldom does it happen that two of the highest ranking officers of the navy are retired for age on the same day, but this was the case with Rear Admiral Robert M. Berry and Captain Harrison G. O. Colby, who were placed on the retired list today on account of having reached the age of 62 years.

Both officers have had long and active careers in the navy. Rear Admiral Berry comes from Kentucky, and was graduated from the naval academy in 1866. Since that time he has served in all the various duties of a naval officer.

During the war with Spain he commanded the battleship Oregon, and in 1898 he was in command of the navy yards at Charleston, Pennsylvania and Norfolk.
