WEATHER REPORT A shallow low pressure area is central over Washington and another small disturbance overlies Arizona. The barometer is relatively high over central California. The distribution of pressure has caused light rain in western Oregon and western Washington, light showers in northeastern Washington, northern Idaho and northern Arizona, and moderately heavy rain in extreme southern California. The feature of the weather map this morning is an intense high pressure area, with an attendant cold wave, which is central over the upper Mississippi valley. Zero temperatures are reported nearly as far south as Omaha and as far east as Chicago, and freezing temperatures are reported as far south as Arkansas. The high has fallen in the Ohio valley and lower lake region and at scattered places in the middle Atlantic and New England sections.
