

HIGH FINANCE IN CHILE BANK

Santiago Institution With \$3,000,000 Deposits Has \$4,000 in Its Vault.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Santiago, Cal., Jan. 29.—The government is in trouble over the condition of its credit, which daily grows more critical. The bonds hypothecated on the customs duties have fallen to 80 per cent discount, being thus almost valueless. The industrial bank of this city has closed its doors, against \$3,000,000 deposits, with only \$4,000 in its vaults to pay the last check offered before closure, of \$2,000.
