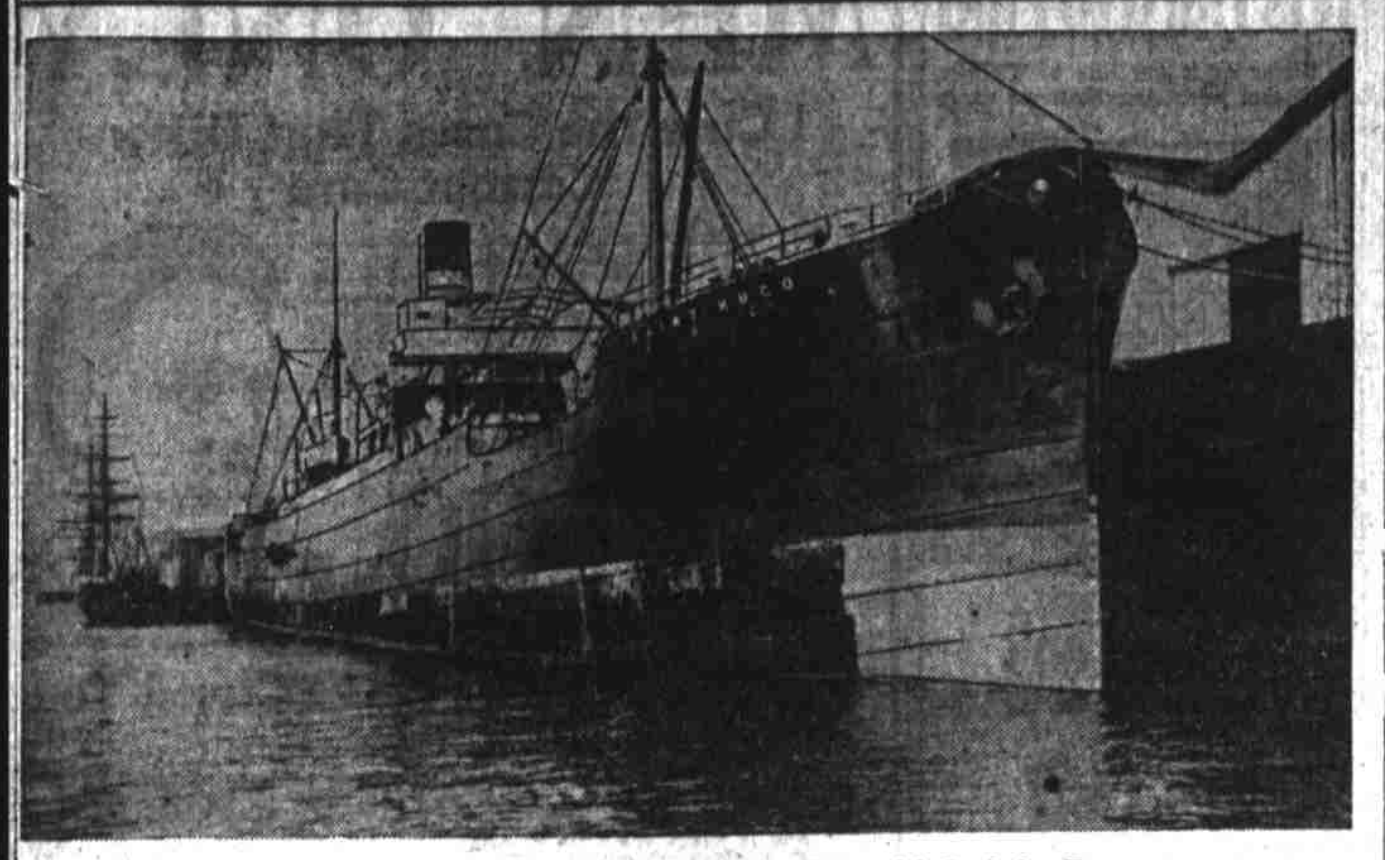


TRAMP FREIGHT CARRIER LOOKS NEAT AS PASSENGER BOAT.
