Judge McBride Dismisses the Condemnation Proceedings Brought by the Mount Hood Company for Right of Way.

Judge McBride dismissed the condemnation suit brought by the Mount Hood Power company to compel the city to give the company a right of way across city property near the junction of the Bull Run and Sandy rivers in the state circuit court yesterday afternoon at Oregon City on the ground that the company had not made proper application from the city water board for the right of way. This means that the city has won its first blood in its fight with the power company and it is probable that a compromise will be effected whereby the city will grant the right of way in exchange for all water rights the company claims to have for the surplus water in Bull Run river.
