WITHERSPOON SCORES TRIUMPH

After all the voice is only a very small part of a successful singer. There must be a mind behind it and an artistic sense, and these two qualities can make a lack of voice appear as a fairly good one. When to these assets is added a splendid, big, resonant, tuneful voice, a singer and his hearers are doubly pleased.
Such a singer is Herbert Witherspoon. As he sings one feels that he has made a mental picture of his work before he has brought it out, and the result is perfection. A slight cold which the basso was troubled last night, at his concert at the Hellig deteriorated nothing from his work, for his singing is overshadowed any slight voice defect. He sang a long, a very long program, and was applauded to the echo to the very last. His triumph was signal though there were few there to witness it.
Mr. Witherspoon has a delightful air of informality that wins his audience readily and gives birth to a feeling of mutual understanding, an air that suits him for that most delightful of musical affairs, a lecture-recital. After completing his opening numbers, both so well known—a Judas Maccabaeus' aria and the beautiful "Evening Star Song" from Tannhauser—he stepped down with the confidence of one who knows, from his position of formality and asked simply for permission to preface his songs with remarks and explanations.
That his confidence in the people's friendship was not misplaced was attested by the applause which followed his request and the warm, "homey" feeling that pervaded the house the rest of the evening. All were at one with the singer and it seemed that they were talking with him, and they certainly were feeling with him. It is an art to be able to take hold of an audience that way.
The next number was a selection from "Figaro," sparkling with humor and teasing and tossed off in a lively, taunting manner that brought the house. The next group was a collection of German songs of the old ballad style, the later heroic song, and the newer realistic music represented by Strauss and Hans Hermann. One might say that Witherspoon is at his best in the German repertoire only that when he sings anything else he seems at his best in that. But Schubert's ghost song was sung with such splendid tragedy, the Schumann wall of a heartick soul with such depth of pain; Schumann's "Knaabe mit dem wunderhorn" with such an air of camaraderie; the Halle "Waldenmusik" with such daintiness that each was a perfect bit.
In that group was Hans Hermann's dreamy "Helle Nacht" so beautifully sung that it had to be repeated, but no number was better done than Strauss' "Im Spatboot," hard to sing and beautiful to hear, with a wonderful accompaniment of the boat's motion excellently done by Mrs. Witherspoon at the piano. Bainty, too, was her moonlight accompaniment of the Hermann number. "The Three Comrades," was sung in English with splendid tone color.
The English group following included one of his best songs, "The Pauper's Drive," done with intensity, and with a rapid and splendid change from the Devil-may-care to the "God-does-care" mood. A delightful pastorelle and Hermann Lohr's fine "Messmates" were well sung. The French group, though well sung, was not so popular, merely because the songs did not appeal quite so readily as the others. A Bluet song of good fellowship caught hold the best.
The old songs from Britain were charming, but when the singer struck into a catching Irish brogue and sang two songs from the uplands and the middle of Ireland, there were many that thought he was from old Ireland himself, and the delight broke into an open laugh.
Mr. Witherspoon was warmly encouraged and repeated several songs and gave by request "Mother o' Mine," for which he is famous. Other encores were "Memory," by Edna Park, and "Annie Laurie." Throughout his work was characterized by a lack of the usual belabored quality of the basso, and there was no attempt to roll about on the lower notes to show his depth of voice. Rather, most of his work was done in the middle register and his upper notes developed some surprisingly sweet, pure tones of almost tenor quality. His pianissimo was as dainty as of lighter voices, and when his lowest notes were sounded they were rich and round and mellow. Withal his stage presence, his charming air of informality, his sincerity and his pleasure in his own work made it a delightful recital.
Mrs. Witherspoon accompanied him with sympathy and understanding. She was equal to the most difficult part of her task. At a request from Mr. Witherspoon for aid, several in the audience prevailed on Mrs. Warren Thomas to go to the rostrum to turn the pages in the rapid accompaniments.
