The accident occurred at the Macy street crossing where several serious collisions have taken place. The body of Conductor Carter of the Pacific Electric coach which was crushed in the wreckage, was towed to the morgue instantly killed, while not a trainman or passenger escaped injury. Carter had gone ahead of his car to see if the Salt Lake track was clear. Seeing nothing, he signalled the motorman to come ahead. As the car was half way across the track the freight train struck it in the middle.
