ONE OF KLAMATH'S DISCOVERERS GONE

Joseph Conger Saw the Possibilities of That Resourceful Region as Early as 1873.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Klamath Falls, Or., Feb. 4.—Joseph Conger, one of Klamath county's oldest citizens, is dead, at his home here, at the age of 76 years. He came across the plains from Pike county, Indiana, in 1852, and after staying for a time at Coos Bay, and later at Treka, he came into Klamath Falls in 1873, approaching Klamath Falls, then Linkville, from the east. He was a pioneer settler, overlooking Link river, and saw below him on the opposite bank a favored spot, sheltered and on the river's bank. He decided to make that spot his home, and for many years he cultivated an orchard and garden there.
