NEW LINE TO SWIFT LOCATION

Portland Railway, Light & Power Company Will Extend Road Soon as Packing House Buildings Are Under Way.

Corporation May Also Furnish Electric Power to Immense Plant of Big Concern—Matter of Traffic Arrangements Considered.

The Portland Railway, Light & Power company will extend its lines to the site of the Swift packing plant as soon as the buildings are well under way. The extension to "Swiftville" will either tap the Vancouver line or be built from Portland.

SYNDICATE DECLINES TO SETTLE

Compromise Offered on Behalf of Oregon Trust Bank Depositors Is Rejected—Involves United Railways Stock and Bonds.

Herman Wittenberg and Others Will Probably Ignore Proposition to Return Receiver's Securities—Substance of Proposal.

The Wittenberg syndicate now in control of the United Railways company has declined to pay \$100,000 for 40-100 of the entire United Railways company capital stock and all of its bonds. This is the effect of the syndicate's refusal of a compromise offered by the receiver of the Oregon Trust & Savings bank, through W. C. Morris, former cashier of the bank, to A. C. Emmons, attorney for the syndicate.

ASSETS OF COMPANY.

The compromise offered by the receiver, and ignored by the syndicate, is based on a valuation of only \$100,000 for the bank's claim. The total commercial assets of the United Railways company amount to \$450,000 of bonds and \$2,700,000 of stock. The company's total stock issue is \$3,000,000.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Pendleton, Or., Feb. 10.—The first candidate to announce himself for the legislature in eastern Oregon is Charles A. Barrett, Republican, of Athena, who represented Umatilla county in the house the last session and who has announced himself for reelection.

FIVE THOUSAND MEN GO BACK TO WORK AT TUBE COMPANY

(United Press Leased Wire.) Loraine, Ohio, Feb. 10.—Five thousand men were put back to work today by the National Tube company. They had been idle for several weeks, but the company now reports orders sufficient to employ another 1,000 men as well as they can be secured.

Washington, Feb. 10.—Senator Fulton is preparing to leave for home March 15. He is hurrying through pressing duties and must have two weeks in which to dispose of claims provided for in the house private war claims in the omnibus appropriation bill, which in the senate goes to the committee of which he is chairman.

The senator has also his bill amending the rate law on which he must do much work. No new matters arising, he believes he can get away in a month. "Then," says he, "I shall go to answer Henry's every charge to the bitter end."

Word has been received in Portland by personal and political friends of Senator Fulton that he intends to return to Oregon during the latter days of March in order to answer the charges made against him by F. J. Henry. The news has also been passed around to a few that as soon as Senator Fulton arrives on the scene and begins his task of refutation Mr. Henry will hold up from San Francisco and take another fall out of the senator either in person or by a signed statement prepared by him and sent to the press of Portland for publication.

Friends of Senator Fulton have been urging that he return to Oregon contrary to his previous announced intention of remaining in Washington during the campaign. It has been represented to the senator that in taking into consideration the possibility of refuting the charges made, which it is supposed the senator can do, yet the wide publicity given the remarks of Mr. Henry has had a damaging effect upon his cause and has militated against his return to Oregon as soon as possible in order to personally clear up the situation by his defense.

WILL TOUR STATE.

It is intimated that the senator when he returns to Oregon will make another trip throughout the state, speaking at all of the principal cities and towns, and will on these occasions make his defense of his career directly to the people from the platform. This trip, coming as it will directly in the face of the primaries, is expected to do a great deal toward winning back to the senator the support which has been lost by reason of the attack made upon him by Mr. Henry, both in his public address and during the course of the John Hall trial.

HENRY MAY RETURN.

It is said in some quarters that Mr. Henry is planning to come back to Oregon and make his further charges against the senator in person. One reason that Mr. Henry did not make the second address for which he was scheduled, it is said, was because he had learned that Senator Fulton had made up his mind to return to Oregon during the last of March. When he learned of this Mr. Henry is said to have told those who were urging him to deliver a second address that he would save his ammunition in this city today and return, when he would fire the second volley directly at the senator. Whether he does this, however, will depend upon conditions in San Francisco. If he is not able to come to Oregon he will spare his remaining material in written form and send it to the Oregon press for publication at about the time of Senator Fulton's campaign of defense.
