### VICTIM OF FATAL JOKE

**Officer Hepner Shoots and Kills John Wetle, Life Long Friend--Policeman Believed He Was Being Held Up by Robber.**

In an attempt to play a joke on a young policeman whom he had known since childhood, John Wetle, a married man with a family of seven children, was killed by Officer Hepner near the homes of both men in Fulton Park last night. Wetle attempted to hold up Hepner in a lonely place with a tobacco pipe and was shot dead by the officer. Wetle was an old policeman and had served on the force under Mayor Penoyer. Hepner was appointed under the civil service regulations just one month ago, January 14.

of the pockets of which was his gun. His hand was on the gun.

**Realizes What He Has Done.**

Quickly the officer whipped out his gun and shot. "Oh, my God, Fritz," cried the man, and Hepner knew at once by the voice that he had shot his friend, John Wetle. The shot was fatal. The bullet passed through Wetle's heart and he expired within a few minutes.

Hepner then hurried to the home of Officer Emson, near the scene of the shooting, but Emson was not at home. He then went farther down the hill to where Louis D. Freeland, superintendent of the Oregon Furniture Manufacturing company, lives, and telephoned to the station. Detective Price was detailed to investigate the case and Coroner Finley was notified.

It is the opinion of the police and those who live in the vicinity and know both men that Wetle sought to try the mettle of the young officer by trying to hold him up. In Wetle's hand was found a common tobacco pipe, which in the darkness Hepner took for a gun. Wetle's hat was pulled down over his eyes and his coat collar turned up, and when he gave the order to Hepner to hold up his hands, Wetle had endeavored to silence his voice. Wetle was coming home from his work at the time, and Hepner was going to his home. Hearing the familiar whistle of Hepner along the path, Wetle laid in ambush for him.

**Leaves Large Family.**

Wetle lived next door to Hepner in Fulton Park. They had been friends for years. Wetle was about 40 years old and had a family of seven children, the youngest two being twins not yet 2 years old. The oldest is now nearly 17. Hepner is unmarried and lives with his father and mother and two brothers. He is 25 years old.

Wetle leaves to his large family a \$2,000 policy in the order of the Woodmen of the World. He has three brothers in Portland, one of whom, James J. Wetle, lives next door to him and is employed in the city street contracting and supply department. John Wetle was a city employe in the engineering department. Jacob Wetle, another brother, who lives at 1468 Macadam street, is a poundmaster, and Jacob W. Wetle, a third brother, lives at 1706 East Nineteenth street, Sellwood, and is a puller for Blasinger & Co., tanners.
