WILL TAKE PLACE OF LOST VESSEL

Ship Henry Villard to Join Bristol Bay Fleet This Spring

FAMILY REED WAS TO HAVE MADE TRIP

First Time Historic Square-Rigger Has Been Placed in Bristol Bay Run and It Might Mark Beginning of End of Long Career.

Negotiations were closed yesterday between the Alaska Packers company of Astoria and Hind, Rolph & Company of San Francisco to send the American ship Henry Villard to Alaska next summer.

The Henry Villard is a vessel much similar to the one lost and of about the same dimensions.

This will be the Henry Villard's first voyage in the Bristol Bay cannery fleet, and it is taken to mean that as long as the British bark Kirkcubrightshire, the former bound from this port for Europe with a cargo of wheat, and the latter bound from Iquique for Europe.

The Kirkcubrightshire was spoken off Cape Horn and the Largo Bay in the South Pacific. The Largo Bay left here January 22 for Cork and had been making good time.

The Arctic Stream went to Columbia dock No. 2 last night, while giving room at Martin's dock, where she was discharging cement to the North Pacific company's steamer George W. Elder from San Pedro and way ports.

ENCOUNTERS SEVERE STORMS.
