**KINCAID CANNOT REMEMBER FEES**

**Former Secretary of State Says He Did Not Keep Account of Money.**

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Feb. 20.—The taking of testimony in the suit of the state vs. Harrison K. Kincaid did not elicit much information tending to show how much the official received in fees while filling the office of secretary of state. The state attorney, Elyria, was represented by A. C. Woodcock and George G. Bingham and swore he kept no books of the fees collected by himself. He thought the salary and fees averaged about \$6,000 a year, or \$24,000 for the four years, instead of \$60,000, the amount stated in the recent northwestern department of student affairs. He would not swear positively that he might not have received \$40,000 during his term of office.

**WHITMAN STUDENTS NEARLY OUT OF DEBT**

**Treasurer Reports That Many Obligations Have Been Wiped Out.**
