TINY CARGO FOR STEAMER TUNGUS

Leaves Portland for Hongkong With 700,000 Feet of Lumber. VALUE BARELY COVERS FREIGHT

At daylight this morning the Norwegian steamer Tungus left down from the North Pacific Lumber company's mills in North Portland for Hongkong, with what is believed to be the smallest exclusive and capacity lumber cargo ever shipped that distance on a tramp steamer.

THE FACT that the cargo measures only 761,000 feet shows it to be even smaller than the average cargo of the steam schooners engaged in the lumber traffic on this coast and whose net registry as a rule is but half of that of the Norwegian steam tramp.

THE TUNGUS is under time charter to a firm in Japan and by sending her to Mexico with 450 coolie laborers they could afford to recharter her for lumber for the return voyage, even though she had to run a little out of the straight course.
