

ARGUMENTS DRIVEN INTO SUBMISSION

Argue Matters Over an Hour Before Passing Ordinance to Improve Parks.

With nearly 100 representatives of the Commercial club and chamber of Commerce urging the passage of an ordinance appropriating sufficient money to allow the city park board to employ a new park superintendent at a salary of \$2,500 a year, members of the council, after arguing the question and stating why they had not given the money before, passed the ordinance by a vote of 11 to 3. Councilman Willis absenting himself from the council chamber when the vote was taken.
