

WARRANT TO HIS MONEY BACK

Japanese Kidnapers Who Was Given Immunity From Punishment Bobs Up Again to Secure \$500 Forfeited Bail.

T. Shigeta, the Japanese who forfeited \$500 cash bail because he did not put in an appearance in the police court to face a charge of kidnaping, has again ventured into the open. Shigeta wants his money back.

The attempts made by various reputable members of the local bar to have the order of forfeiture set aside in the lower court having come to naught because of the unwelcome publicity given the matter, Shigeta now appeals to the mayor and the members of the city council to assist him in this, his dire extremity.

Through his present attorney, Richard Morwood McCann, Shigeta has presented to the city council an elaborate petition in which romance and pathos are blended in about equal parts with a minimum of facts and a maximum of untruth. The communication closes with the prayer that the council "remit this forfeiture of \$500 bail money and restore the same to me," and by so doing avert for the petitioner present penalty and future hardship and privation.

Stevenson Blocked Plan.

In his petition Shigeta sets forth a mass of alleged facts as if in ignorance of the ability of officials of the lower court to controvert them. That this apparent ignorance is only assumed is made evident by the manner in which these same officials are being daily impudently to take no action that would be prejudicial to the success of the plan to get the cashed money from the vaults of the city treasury.

These importunities are directed mainly to Deputy District Attorney John Stevenson, who is the state prosecutor in the municipal court and who was instrumental in blocking the initial attempt to annul the forfeiture on fictitious grounds. Other officials have not been exempt, however, and the end is not yet.

The story of the theft of the pretty young wife of Y. Kusaba and the subsequent negotiations conducted by Shigeta for the return of the woman to her husband for a handsome money consideration, has already been told in these columns. Much of the story was, however, left untold because it involved necessary details which were wholly pertinent to the completeness of the tale.

Justice Stumbled and Fell.

Shigeta now appeals to the mayor and the city council for redress for an alleged wrong and it is possible the council will want to know how it came about that the Japanese kidnaper was permitted to go unwhipped of justice; also inquiry may be instituted to ascertain why the kidnaping warrant was issued from the court in the first place; also the character of the female associates of Shigeta and the standing of the Japanese interpreter who conducted negotiations with various lawyers in his behalf; and many other things that might seem to the mind of a member of the city council to have a bearing on the merits of the proposed raid on the city treasury.

At any rate Shigeta wants his money back and is doing his best to get it.

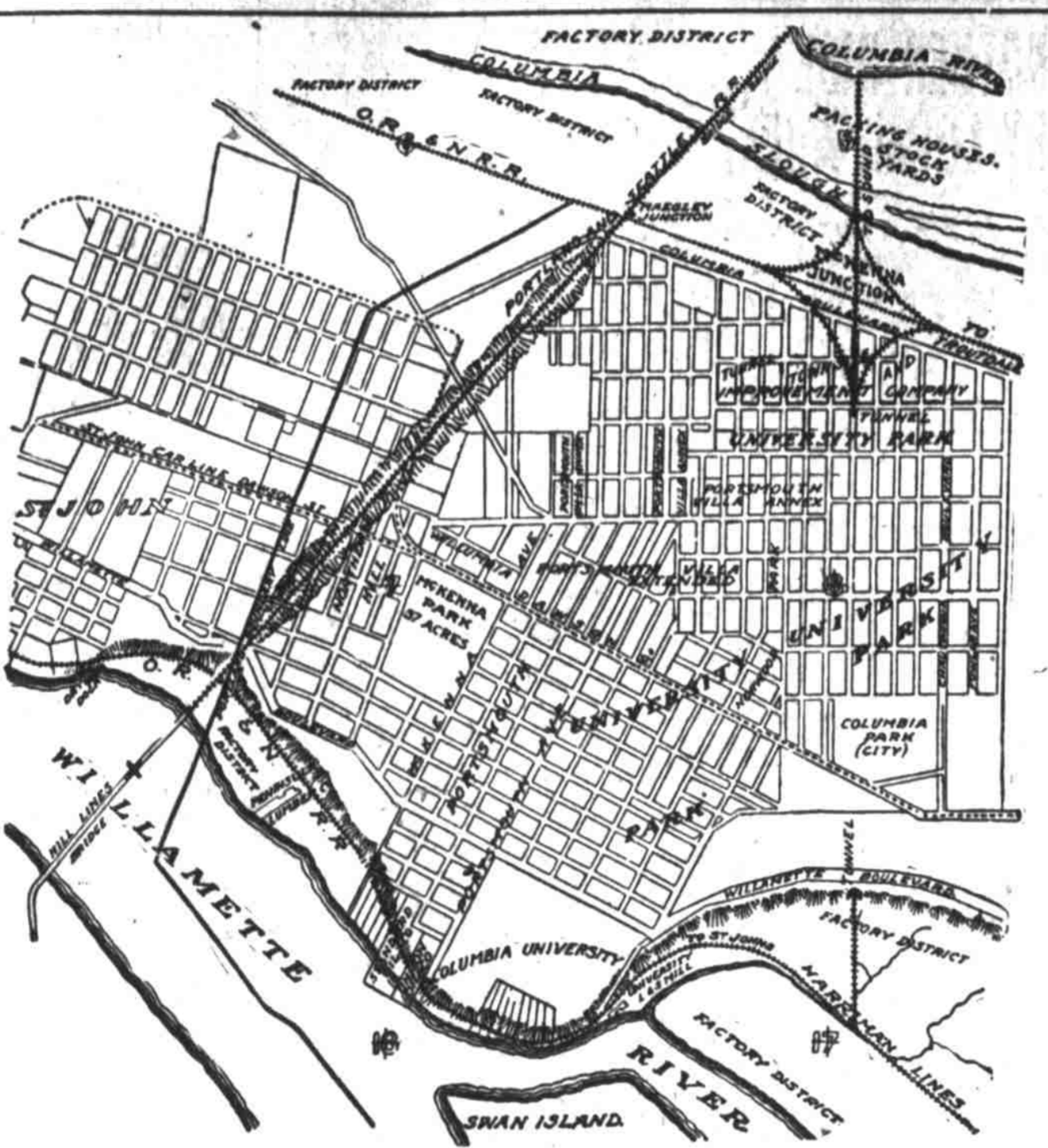
MENTION OF DOCTOR'S NAME EXCITED MYERS

TUNNEL UNDER PENINSULA SOON TO BE DRIVEN FOR HARRIMAN LINE



Map Showing the Entrance of the Hill and Harriman Lines on the Peninsula.

Evidence that is indisputable has come to light making it practically a certainty that the Harriman railroad companies will proceed with their plan to drive a tunnel under the peninsula, and provide a water grade entrance for the Union Pacific system into Portland, and also a water level outlet for the extension of the Harriman roads to Puget sound, via the Vancouver bridge across the Columbia river. This extension will not use the Spokane, Portland & Seattle cut through the peninsula, and there will be no consolidation of the North Portland terminal of the Hill and Harriman railroads, although both companies may use the present passenger station.

The general scheme of entrance of these lines into Portland will, it is said, be in accord with the previous outline published in The Journal by a system of "Y's" at McKenna junction, the O. R. & N. main line from the east will turn its trains into the tunnel, cars or trains can be turned in the opposite direction to the packing-house district, main line freight trains can be run on around the peninsula to St. Johns, or by the same route from St. Johns can be turned in either direction at the same junction.

Mealy junction, which once gave promise of being one of the famous spots, on the map, has been retired to innocuous desuetude. At this point, where the forces of the rival companies engaged in a nocturnal scrimmage and competitive track-building match about a year ago, the Spokane, Portland & Seattle railroad crosses over the O. CITY WILL FIGHT PAVING GOUGE

Company Raises Bid Three Successive Times and Raises Council's Ire.

That efforts will be made by both the city council and the city executive board to hold down the cost of laying hard-surface pavements in Portland was shown by the action of the members of the board at yesterday's meeting. Several members of the street committee at the council's meeting several days ago declared themselves in favor of limiting the price for such pavements and it is probable that some such action will be taken along this line.

The matter was brought to the attention of the board yesterday by the action of the Warren Construction company in raising its bid three successive times for the improvement of Stark street with bitulithic pavement. Although the third bid was \$1,400 higher than the previous bid the executive board awarded the contract for \$16,878, mainly upon the request of numerous large property owners who appeared before the board and urged that the contract be let.

Whether the city will make awards on this line of paving in the future depends largely upon a decision about to be rendered by Judge Cleland in the state circuit court. Property owners on Belmont street contested the right of the city to lay bitulithic pavement and carried their case into court. Judge Cleland is expected to give his decision Monday and the future course of the city will be governed by his opinion.

The fight for cheaper hard-surface paving is not to be waged by the city against the Warren Construction company alone, but against the Barber Asphalt company also. It has been charged that these companies after fighting each other for years have buried the hatchet in Portland and come to an agreement on the minimum price of their reconstructive pavements thus making it impossible for the city to secure competitive bids under a certain price. Several of the councilmen have contended that Portland pays more for its street paving than other cities although the same kind of pavement is used in all places and is put in by the same companies.

AWARD CONTRACT FOR BRIDGE WEDNESDAY

The city executive board rejected the bids of two firms for the reinforced concrete bridge at Twenty-eighth street over Sullivan's gulch yesterday afternoon on recommendation of the bridge committee, and will hold a postponed meeting next Wednesday afternoon at 4 o'clock to award the contract for the remaining bids. The bids rejected yesterday were from Robert Wakefield and the Pacific Engineering company, which were turned down because they were excessive.
