TO DEPORT ANARCHISTS

Chicago Police May Have Emma Goldman Sent Out of Country—San Francisco Authorities Start Campaign Against Reds.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Chicago, March 5.—The state and federal officers in Chicago, together with the municipal authorities, have reached the conclusion that the federal law providing for the deportation of known anarchists may be employed to rid the city of some of the more rabid and danger-

ous of the leaders of the "reds." A test case probably will be made of Emma Goldman, who is regarded as one of the most violent of all the anarchists in this country. Negotiations will be entered into at once with the department of justice at Washington.

In open defiance to the authorities to check the propaganda of anarchists the various groups of Chicago are arranging for lectures by Emma Goldman. Addresses have been extensively advertised to take place in Chicago next Friday night.

Mrs. Leonard Dead.
Astoria, Or., March 5.—Mrs. Annie Leonard Brown, wife of Fred Brown, died yesterday of Bright's disease. She was a native of London, England, aged 63 years, and resided here for 25 years.

REBATE CASE IS POSTPONED

Railroad Commission Will Begin Southern Pacific Hearing Tomorrow.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, March 5.—The investigation by the state railroad commission into alleged rebates granted by the Southern Pacific road to 150 local shippers did not begin this morning on account of a misunderstanding between the members of the chamber of commerce and the railroad commissioners. The commissioners thought they would be allowed to begin the inquiry in the chamber of commerce today, but when all parties interested in the investigation gathered there it developed that another association had engaged it for the morning. The commission then decided to postpone the beginning of the hearing until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Raymond Benjamin. The latter was uncommunicative on the question of the evidence against the road. He said that it is probable that following the conclusion of the Southern Pacific case the commission would at once take testimony on similar charges against the Santa Fe road. The present case is based on facts brought out at the hearing against the Southern Pacific before the interstate commerce commission several months ago, and that the road paid rebates on 4,000 different shipments during the past few years.
