COUPLE IN BED SHOT IN HEADS

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Spokane, Wash., March 12.—Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Curry were both shot as they lay in their bed at home, in this city, at 2 a. m. today, with a .38 calibre revolver. Both were wounded in the head but will recover. They say they were asleep when attacked. Curry says he felt the bed clothes move just before the assailant fired. An infant child with three teeth was found smeared with her blood but was unharmed.

Second Attempt to Kill Mr. and Mrs. Curry at Spokane Fails.

A revolver was found in the kitchen, the door being open. Shots were fired through a window at the family two years ago, but they claim they know of no enemy. The police believe Curry attempted to kill his wife and commit suicide, but there is no evidence to support this theory.

SPECIAL RATE DURING FRISCO NAVAL EVENT

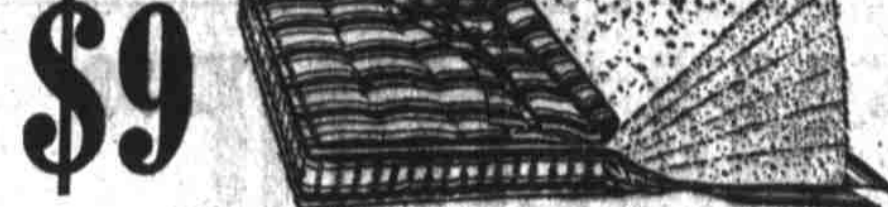
Southern Pacific to Reduce Fares During Visit of Fleet.
