

FATHER YORK COMING TO SPEAK TO PORTLANDERS

Noted San Francisco Clergyman Will Deliver Saint Patrick's Day Oration at National Guard Armory on Tuesday Night—Large Crowd Will Attend.

When Father York of San Francisco, the St. Patrick's day orator, reaches Portland, a great popular demonstration will be accorded him by the labor unions of the city.

Father York is recognized by the laboring men of the Pacific coast as one of the most powerful friends of the friends of labor. He was the chief arbiter in the car strike in San Francisco last year, and several of the unions have already signified their intention of attending the St. Patrick's day celebration that is to be held by the Ancient Order of Hibernians in the armory Tuesday evening.

Many Reserve Seats.
The Longshoremen's union has ordered 200 reserved seats, and the Christian Brothers' College Alumni association has agreed to have its members attend the celebration in a body. W. F. Sinnott, president of the association, has appointed a reception committee to attend to the seating of the former pupils of the college and their wives and friends. As the members enter the hall they will be presented with a souvenir badge in the college colors.

The souvenir programs which have been completed include an historical account of the A. O. H. and the Christian Brothers as a teaching order. The Ancient Order of Hibernians has arranged to donate the proceeds of the celebration to the building fund of the Christian Brothers' Business college, which is to have a new home in East Portland.

Seated on the stage will be the Most Rev. Archbishop Christie, Father York, the clergy, officers and members of the A. O. H., Governor Chamberlain and city officials.
