ONE PUNCH DOES FOR IRISH LEMON

Tommy Burns Knocks Out Jem Roche in Minute and a Half.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
 Dublin, March 18.—One punch before half a round had been fought last night settled Jem Roche, the Irish champion, and gave Tommy Burns, the American heavyweight champion, his third straight victory over the best fighters in the British Isles. A short hook to the jaw settled Roche so quickly that the immense audience, which had paid heavily to see the mill, turned away in disgust. Both fighters took their corners while the band played "The Boys of Wexford" for Jem and "The Star Spangled Banner" for the American. When Richard Croker, former Tammany leader, who was chiefly instrumental in promoting the big fight, entered the theater he was given an ovation from the 4,000 spectators who crowded every seat in the place.

When the song sounded, the American shot to the middle of the ring and commenced sparring for an opening, at the same time trying to bring Roche out. Roche put his hands up awkwardly after hitting Burns' guard. A moment later Tommy feinted, drawing Roche's hands away from his head. The chance was too good to lose, and Burns shot a terrific right hook to the unprotected jaw of the slow-thinking Irishman.

Roche went down on a slant and slide over the canvas on his back, turning on his face in an effort to regain his feet. Roche was seized by the suddenness of the blow and it robbed him of all his strength. Even after he regained his feet following the counting out, he staggered around the ring before his brain cleared up. Then he walked over to Burns and shook hands with his conqueror.

The fight lasted one minute and 38 seconds, and Burns copped the purse of \$7,500, the side bet of \$2,000, in addition to \$7,000 which he had bet on himself.

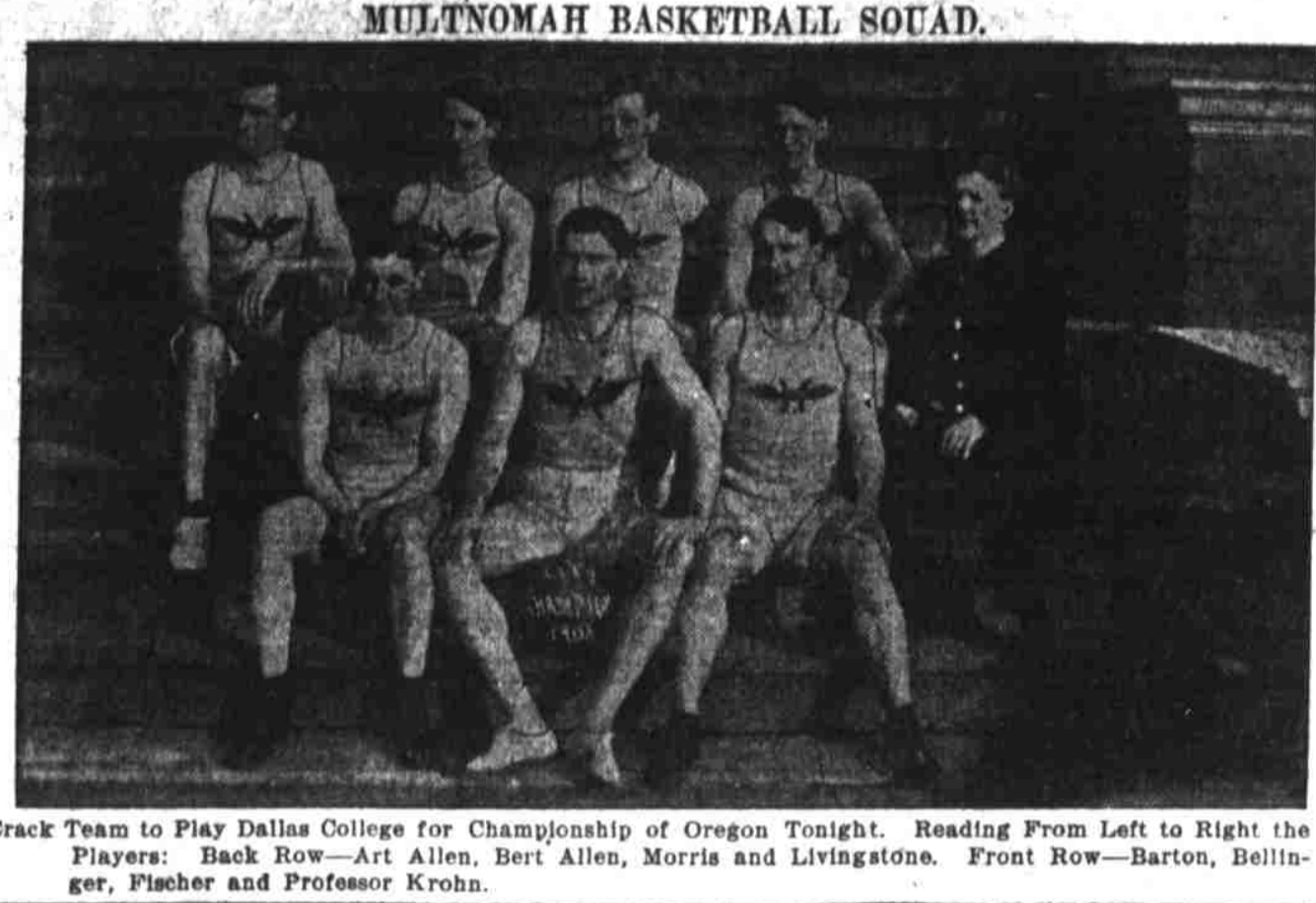

Both of these middleweights are in prime condition for a fast and have only gotten together after much wrangling.

The match is best three out of five, and the sports will surely get a run for their money. Scholtes says he will win the first fall in a twinkling, while the "Strangler" has asserted on more than one occasion that he can put the kibosh on The Dalles man in a very few seconds.
