JUDGE GALLOWAY HAS HANDS FULL

Equity Cases Piling Up in Three Counties Make Too Much Work.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Salem, March 18.—The circuit court docket of this district has become so congested that unless the number of suits filed in the future diminishes to a considerable extent or the circuit judge of some other district can come to the assistance of Judge Galloway, it is doubtful if the majority of the cases begun can be heard before several months at the earliest.

Judge Galloway of the equity department of the circuit court, after sitting for five weeks almost consecutively in this county, has nearly 150 open cases still on his docket. This same number of cases were on his docket when he began his present term five weeks ago, and in spite of the disposal of more than 100, the number remains unchanged, new suits pouring in continually.

COURT HONORS HAILEY'S MEMORY

Judge Galloway Continues All Marion County Cases Until Tomorrow.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Salem, March 18.—The circuit court, Judge Galloway presiding, adjourned today in respect to the late Judge Thomas G. Hailey at the unanimous request of the bar association of this city.

The case of the state against ex-Secretary of State P. L. Dunbar to recover nearly \$100,000 claimed to have been illegally collected, was continued until 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.

Development of an exciting nature may take place when court opens up, Dunbar having been ordered to appear at that time and show cause and produce his private memorandum books, in which were recorded the fees he took while in office. At the close of the last hearing it was understood he would fail to appear, and his attorneys would appeal under a bond to the supreme court.

LAND OFFICE GIVES FOREST SERVICE BIFF

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Silver Lake, Or., March 18.—The contests arising from the recent opening of lands in the Sican country, which resulted in much confusion, and discomfitment to land and homeseekers, have in nearly every case gone against the homesteader and in favor of the timber locator, on the ground that the claims were unsuited to the requirements of the homestead laws and were purely timber propositions. Hence the commissions are relinquishing and filing timber claims instead.

This is the land that was temporarily reopened for settlement last September as unsuited to forestry purposes, but suitable for settlement and upon which squatters were given 30 days for making good on homesteads previous to the filing date.

WELLS-FARGO REFUSES TO PAY IN DOUGLAS

Roseburg, Or., March 18.—The Wells-Fargo Express company has refused to pay the taxes levied upon its property in this county because the tax heretofore has been but about \$8.50, while this year it is \$800. It has 12 offices in this county, of which Roseburg is the largest, and the authorities believe the amount of business transacted by the company and its assessable property amply justify the assessment that Assessor Staley has seen fit to levy this year. It seems the company's holdings have been overlooked heretofore.

RAILROAD OFFICIALS TO BE PROSECUTED

Washington, March 18.—Criminal prosecutions of officers of the Chesapeake and Ohio road were forecasted today in a report made by the interstate commerce commission following an extensive hearing at Richmond, Virginia. The report charges that for years the road has been favoring certain grain and packing house shippers by means of issuing bogus transfer slips.
