MARQUIS SOUGHT AN HEIRESS. Townshend's Suit Discloses That He Made Title-Selling Tour of America.

London, March 24.—The Marquis of Townshend's suit to remove Arthur Geoffrey Robins and John Abercrombie as trustees of a deed of settlement of the Townshend estates made in 1903, and under which a number of heirlooms were disposed of, has come to an end.

At the conclusion of the case the judge, when ordering Robins' removal from the trusteeship, paid a compliment to the marquis as to the way he had given evidence. It is surmised that the marquis' health has improved since the lengthy proceedings, thus his mental capacity has increased.

COUNTESS WANTS "HONEST SPOUSE". Titled Hungarian Girl Prefers Farmer to an "Aristocratic Loafer".

Budapest, March 24.—Countess Henrietta Pongracz, seventeen years old, has asked the civil court for minors to be allowed to "marry an honest man instead of an aristocratic loafer."

"Countess Henrietta's 'honest man' is a young farmer, Johann Ondrasik, the name of the 'aristocratic loafer' referred to in her bill, whom her proud parents want her to wed, is withheld by the court.
