Every Place Selling Groceries Will Be Closed Today

—Edict Issued by District Attorney—Some Dealers Were Violating Law.

Because a great many clear dealers and proprietors of small confectionery stores have put in stocks of groceries that they sell on Sunday to the detriment of many small grocers who are observing the law, the retail grocers' association of Portland has caused the district attorney to close all those stores where groceries are sold. The proprietors were notified by the police during the past week. Today no groceries can be bought, not even bread or milk.
