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JOHN MITCHELL LEAVES OFFICE

Labor Leader Retires From Presidency of United Mine Workers.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Indianapolis, Ind., April 1.—John Mitchell, the eminent leader, retired today as president of the United Mine-workers of America, and was succeeded by Thomas L. Lewis of Ohio. Mr. Mitchell stepped down after spending many years of his life in the labor movement and gaining the reputation of being one of the world's foremost labor leaders. Under his wise leadership, the union miners have grown from a mere handful to an organization with 300,000 members. The element of his whole career, which stands out most prominently, is his consummate manipulation of the great strike in the anthracite district in 1902. Mr. Mitchell has not announced his plans for the future, but his name is mentioned as a probable Democratic candidate for governor of Illinois. His home is at Spring Valley, Illinois.
