Mr. and Mrs. Robert Harrison Have Lived Long in Linn and Have Prospered.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Brownsville, Or., April 1.—Mr. and Mrs. Robert Harrison, residing three miles north of this place, have celebrated their fifty-first wedding anniversary. They are hale and hearty and the chances are they will live to celebrate several more. Mr. Harrison, or Uncle Bob, as he is familiarly called, is a pioneer of 1852 and was 80 years old last month. He is of English birth, coming to Michigan when 20 years of age. He was in southern Oregon in the time of the Indian war, having driven a band of hogs intending to sell them to the miners. A Mr. Bailey, just ahead of him, was killed by the Indians, and Mr. Harrison escaped back to the valley, having lost a fortune by the Indians taking his hogs. He settled on a land claim near Brownsville, where he still lives.
