NO INDEPENDENT LABOR TICKET

New York Union Leaders Decide Not to Create Presidential Ticket.

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, April 2.—There will be no independent labor ticket in the field for the coming presidential campaign if New York labor leaders have their way.

It was the opinion among these men today that the determination of the American Federation of Labor to "give congress another chance," has necessitated the laying aside of the project of workingman's party.

Just what the definite plan of action will be will not be determined until Sunday when there will be a meeting of the Central Federal union. It is expected that at that time the resolution demanding that the American Federation call for a new party to organize an independent party will be tabled.

TEXANS AFRAID OF BOODSHED OF BOODSHED Quarrel Over United States Senator Bailey Expected to Result in Tragedy.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Dallas, Tex., April 2.—The special primary election commission to determine whether United States Senator Bailey should be elected as a delegate-at-large to the national Democratic convention at Denver, has become exceedingly bitter and there are fears of bloodshed.

Clarence Ousley, editor of the Fort Worth Record and state campaign manager for Bailey, today prints an earnest warning to the enemies of Senator Bailey. After reviewing the assassination of President Lincoln, Garfield and McKinley, the warning is introduced: "Circumstances which will not be recited in detail foreshadow developments of the pending political campaign which if not averted will disgrace the nation."

Following this article says: "Within the last 16 days two men have been heard to declare that Senator Bailey ought to be killed, and one of them in a public restaurant, in the hearing of several persons, said that he would be glad to pay the expenses of any man who would do the deed. There is danger of the gravest kind if the leaders of the various divisions of the passionate and desperate individuals who attach themselves to any cause, and especially to any adventure that is hazardous or spectacular."

At that time he is about to take a wife, he has kept his word, for the bride is to be his old sweetheart, now Mrs. M. M. Clark, who convinced Mulholland that the wedding bells were not for her when she married another man. He went west to forget it and became the owner of a great business. He learned recently that Mrs. Clark was a widow he proposed to her and was accepted. The marriage will take place shortly.

NO ACTION UPON ORCHARD SENTENCE

Can't Be No. 1; His Hubby No. 2. Owne Mulholland Waits for Woman He Vowed, as Youth, to Marry.

Boise, Idaho, April 2.—The case of Harry Orchard was not considered by the Idaho board of pardons which met yesterday, owing to the fact that no application for commutation of the death sentence had been made. The law requires four weeks' publication of the application in the county where the crime was committed, and this has not been done.

WHITNEY CHARGED WITH MANSLAUGHTER

The coroner's jury impaneled yesterday afternoon to investigate the cause of the death of Miss Mabel Wirtz, returned the following verdict: "We, the jury, find that Mabel Wirtz came to her death at 303 1/2 College street, in Portland, Multnomah county, Oregon, on Monday morning, between 2 and 3 o'clock, March 30, 1936, from mercuric poisoning or some other corrosive agent furnished to the deceased by one G. B. Whitney."

Several witnesses were examined by the coroner, among them being Dr. J. Allen Gilbert, Dr. Ray Matson, Albert Watson of Forest Grove, and Mrs. Lizzie Wirtz, an aunt of Miss Wirtz.

Whitney is being held in the county jail on a charge of manslaughter, and will be arraigned in the justice court tomorrow.

YOUNG WOMAN FOUND IN SIGNAL SALOON

O. Cole, one of the proprietors, and T. Rice, bartender of the Signal saloon, 148 Sixth street, advised every description of a young woman, who was arrested shortly after midnight last night on a charge of permitting a female minor to remain in the saloon. The woman, Vera Clifford, was also placed under a charge of vagrancy being booked against her.

In the police court this morning the young woman pleaded guilty to the vagrancy charge and was ordered to appear in court tomorrow for sentence. The charge against Cole and Rice will be heard next Monday morning, when it is expected that they will be released.
