ARMY STORE IS VICTIMIZED

Secondhand Dealers Profit by Buying Cheap Clothes Intended for Needy.

That the second-hand dealers in clothing have made a practice of sending their agents to the Salvation Army Industrial home at 84 Union avenue, for the purpose of buying clothing at an advantageous price to be resold again on the west side of the river at a profit, is the charge made by Adjutant J. R. Stanley, who is in charge of the Salvation Army store on the east side. It is an established rule at the store not to sell to any person who looks like a second-hand dealer.

At one time the practice became so flagrant that we were compelled to acquaint ourselves with every second-hand dealer in Portland in order to protect ourselves from these impostors upon us, said Adjutant Stanley this morning. "Now when anybody comes in that has the appearance of a second-hand clothing man we either refuse to sell to him directly or put up the price so high that they cannot afford to buy from our stock.

Our stock is gathered in all parts of the city. We could not give a clothing every day that is good and we get as much of it as possible. If the clothes need mending we do that and then sell them at a nominal price. We sell waists and skirts for 10 cents a piece sometimes, and overcoats for 10 cents. We could not give a clothing away because we would then be stocking every second-hand store in Portland in a short time."

Mr. and Mrs. Harris, who live near the corner of North Sixteenth and Front streets, made the complaint that they were unable to buy anything at the Salvation Army store on Union avenue, at a price that would enable them to obtain needed clothing for themselves and family. They say one of the men in charge of the home asked an enormous price for everything they wished to buy.
