Today the banks of the Thames were lined with people to witness the final practice work of the two crews and to draw a line on their condition. INTERNATIONAL MATCH TONIGHT IS ON SQUARE

Chicago, April 2.—Certainly there can be no complaint registered on the score of lack of condition by the loser in tonight's wrestling match between George Hackenschmidt, the "Russian Lion," champion of the world, and Frank Gotch, the American champion. Both men are as fit as perfect training can make them.

All the "inside information" has it that, despite the bad repute into which the wrestling game has dropped in this country, tonight's match will be on the square. Should it prove to be, and especially should the American prove the winner, the sport will probably receive a marked boost.

The men will wrestle tonight for a \$10,000 purse split 60 and 40. Hackenschmidt is a 2-to-1 favorite, but Gotch looks good to many at that price, and there promises to be plenty of money in sight on both sides. Ed Smith will referee the main bout which will be preceded by several preliminaries.
