Commander of Fleet Declares He Will Be on the Bridge of Flagship Connecticut When It Passes Through Golden Gate.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Paso Robles, Cal., April 2.—Rear-Admiral Evans is confident today, in view of his already marked improvement, that he will recover his health in time to rejoin the fleet before it reaches San Francisco, and is telling his friends that when his flagship, the Connecticut, passes through Golden Gate he will be on the bridge.

San Francisco, April 2.—Four million dollars is the enormous amount of money that will be spent in San Francisco by the crew of the Atlantic fleet and the crowd that will come to view the naval display, if figures compiled by the fleet committee can be relied upon.

Seattle, April 3.—Senator Samuel H. Piles has telegraphed the Chamber of Commerce that Secretary Metcalf believes the fleet will be in Seattle May 24 or 25.

San Diego, Cal., April 3.—An unprecedented record for work with the big guns was established at Magdalena Bay by the 12-inch gun battery of the Louisiana, commanded by Lieutenant Evans, son of the admiral, according to an official report.

Navy Yard, Puget Sound, Washington, April 3.—The decision of officials here to work large night crews in order to complete work on the ships in time for the fleet's departure is being met in certain classes of repair work on ships here as hard to find has created a great demand for men.
