Seth Low Says Cotton and Wheat Growers Violate Anti-Trust Law When They Combine to Guard Their Interests.

Washington, D. C., April 4.—That the cotton and wheat growers and farmers of the United States violate the law when they combine to protect themselves and that in seeking this protection they are equally guilty with illegal business combinations was one of the arguments made today by Seth Low, former mayor of New York, when he appeared before the judicial committee of the house in behalf of the Sherman anti-trust law.
