

FIGHT SALOONS IN ILLINOIS Two Thousand Cities and Villages Will Vote on Question Tuesday.

Chicago, Ill., April 4.—The hottest and most extensive fight in Illinois is nearing the finish. Next Tuesday nearly 2,000 cities and villages will vote on the question of "wet or dry?"

Every city of central Illinois, with the exception of Peoria, will vote upon the prohibition question. The largest of these is Springfield, the capital of the state, where the 14,000 registered voters will rally to the polls to decide whether or not the 210 saloons of the city should be closed.

In all the other cities and towns the campaign has been equally interesting. The clerical and professional classes are being urged to vote for prohibition.
