

FARMER DRIVEN FROM HIS HOME

Night Riders Force Poor Family to Tramp 50 Miles to Save Lives.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
 Paducah, Ky., April 4.—Henry Jackson, his wife and five children, ranging in ages from 4 to 16 years, night-rider refugees, arrived in Paducah last night after tramping more than 50 miles. They crossed the Cumberland river and the Tennessee river. Jackson said that after several visitations of night riders he found the usual note and cartridge and switches upon his doorstep, warning him to leave within two days. Jackson is a poor farmer. One child was bare-footed and the others poorly clad.
 For 15 nights they slept upon the bare ground, wrapped in what bed-clothes they could take along. They spent their last cent for bread yesterday and reached Paducah footsore and hungry.

No Mincing of Words.
 "In declaring myself a candidate for the Republican nomination for district attorney for the Fourth judicial district it is my desire to express confidence in and the purpose to apply the spirit of American fair play as a controlling factor in the politics and the administration of public business of this community.
 Under the commercial conditions of the age the general habits and business conduct have permitted the game of every day life to become complex, and it is daily becoming unusual. But the safety of that society and those individuals against the offenses and depredations committed by those whose avarice or viciousness jeopardize the business or politics, have no place or voice in the enforcement of laws wherever or whenever that place or voice is used to that interest.
 Will Go After Grifters.
 "Therefore my purpose and policy, if the Republican voters of this judicial district nominate and elect me as the next district attorney will be:
 "1. To exhaust every effort to secure to every person, in public or private life, fair and impartial treatment and the protection guaranteed by the laws and constitution of this state, and to secure to the public the public service to which it is entitled.
 "2. To enforce the Sunday closing laws.
 "3. To enforce the gambling laws.
 "4. To do my best to convict every person practicing medicine or surgery in an unlawful manner.
 "5. To enforce the laws we have for the protection of minors, both boys and girls.
 "6. To enforce the laws of this state relating to labor.
 "7. To enforce the laws generally.
 "8. To carefully investigate grafting and bribery rumors, and if evidence of grafting or bribery sufficient to secure and sustain convictions can be found, to prosecute the offenders.
 Cole Free of All Strings.
 "I am not pledged, bound or promised to any faction, nor will I become so in any matter connected with my office or official career. Office should not be sought or occupied for private advantages or private honor, but I do consider that honest purpose and zeal to acquire and retain a reputation as a lawyer in a public position frees such position from undue influences, political or otherwise, and provides a stimulus to every citizen's satisfaction in the performance of duty.
 "Lastly I desire the public to understand that I am a Republican and that if elected, no political influences or promises to control or interfere with the duties of the office of district attorney, and I will exert my utmost to resist and destroy such control or interference to the end that this community may have the full benefit and protection of the laws."
