LARGE REGISTRATIONS SHOWS CITY'S GROWTH

COMMISSION REPORTS ON RAILROADS

Interstate Commerce Body Gives Interesting Facts and Figures Regarding Intercorporate Relationships of Lines.

Deals With Holding Companies Which Exist Merely to Deal in Securities of Other Corporations in Active Trade.

Washington, April 7.—Interesting facts and figures regarding the intercorporate relationships of railways in the United States are contained in the first special report of the interstate commerce commission. The result of statistical tabulations shows that out of \$18,000,000,000 of outstanding securities, \$5,300,000,000 is held by railway corporations, leaving outstanding in the hands of the public about \$12,700,000,000 of funded debt and \$4,700,000,000 of stock.

TWO LIVES LOST IN FRISCO FIRE

Man and Wife Burned to Death and Two Firemen Seriously Injured.

San Francisco, April 7.—William Hayes and his wife are dead and the lives of two firemen are today hanging as if by threads as the result of a fire that attacked the Hayes home shortly after midnight. The two firemen—Samuel and R. G. Brown—were rushing to the scene when an automobile of the Underwriters' Patrol in which they were riding, collided with a hook and ladder truck, throwing them with violence to the pavement. In the meantime the Hayes residence was burning furiously, while crowds of excited neighbors stood in the street shouting that several persons had perished in the flames.

New York, April 7.—All opposition of the Gould family to Prince Helle De Sagan has been brushed aside and Madame Anna Gould will marry the cousin of her former husband, Count Raul de Castellane in Paris within a few months.

New York, April 7.—A jury in the United States district court today returned a verdict finding the Great Northern railroad guilty of granting illegal concessions to the American Sugar Refining company. The sentence will be a fine, which will be announced later by the court.

31,400 WILL HAVE NAMES ON BOOKS

Registration List Expected to Exceed 1906 Record Over 10,000—Shows Unprecedented Growth in City and County Population.

Tremendous Rush at Last Hour—Extra Clerks Enlisted—Books Close at 5 Tonight—Expected 1,300 Will Register Today.

This is the last day for the registration of voters, and it is estimated that when the books are closed at 5 o'clock this afternoon there will be 31,400 names on the rolls. All who are in line at 5 o'clock will be allowed to register, but those arriving after that hour will have shut themselves out of the game.

Thousands Not Registered. Despite the big recorded gain, there are yet thousands of voters who have not registered. These will have another chance to register for the general election after the primaries are over. The books will reopen on April 12 and close for the second time on May 15, 15 days before election day.

Extra Clerks Put On. During most of the day there were long lines of voters in waiting. As the pressure increased Mr. Fields called clerks from other work and put them on the registration desk.

COLUMBIAN TROOPS AT JURADO, PANAMA

Washington, April 7.—The state department today admitted that Columbian troops have invaded Jurado, Panama, and, furthermore, that they entered the town with the full knowledge of the Panama government, which was notified of the proposed action by Colombia.

GOODE SAYS HE WILL PRESS CASE AGAINST ELDER COFFEE

Coffee, side of the Free Methodist church of this city, says he is going to see the fight out at any cost. Last night he swore to a warrant before Justice of the Peace Wylie A. Moore, charging Coffee with assault. The minister was placed under arrest in Portland and brought back to this city.

EMMA GOLDMAN GOES TO CANADA; CANNOT RETURN TO STATES

Minneapolis, Minn., April 7.—An opportunity that immigration officials of the United States have been seeking for some time in their efforts to deport Emma Goldman, "Queen of the Anarchists," presented itself today when she was taken back to Canada after crossing the border into Minnesota.

PRESIDENT PREPARES FOR TOUR OF WORLD AFTER TERM EXPIRES

Washington, April 7.—President Roosevelt will make a tour of the world, imitating General Grant, after the expiration of his term of office. He will be absent at least a year. This statement was made authoritatively at the White House today. His declared purpose is going abroad to give Secretary Taft, if he is elected president, a free hand in administering the affairs of the government without any influence from Mr. Roosevelt as far as his policies are concerned.

MONARCHISTS WIN IN PORTUGAL

Result of Elections Believed to Be Death Blow to Republican Party. Washington, April 7.—According to a message received this morning by the state department from Minister Bryan at Lisbon, the monarchists were overwhelmingly victorious in the elections. The monarchists also stated that the disorders in which many citizens were killed or wounded by troops were confined to Lisbon, the rest of Portugal being quiet.

POWER AT DOORS

"We have the water resources to place a light on every corner in the city of Portland, and this water is easy to harness. It belongs to the city, and we could have our lighting plant well under way by the time the present contract expires with the electric company in December. It would be a city-owned plant in darkness for six or eight months rather than be tied down to the Portland Railway, Light & Power company for another five years, which means that still another five years would be tracked on."
