The cloudiness extends over a wide area and snow has fallen in Utah, southern Idaho, Nevada, and northern California. In the western South Dakota, rain in Oklahoma, Missouri and eastern Nebraska. A large high pressure area is occupying the northern part of the barometer is relatively high over the south Atlantic states. It is much warmer in Oklahoma, New Mexico, Kansas, Arizona and western Tennessee, and correspondingly cooler in the extreme upper Mississippi valley, upper Missouri region, southern Nevada, Utah and Colorado.
