San Francisco, April 8.—Mrs. Blanche Boardman, widow of the late Joseph Boardman, an aged millionaire, has started what promises to be a bitterly fought contest to have her husband's

Admiral and General S. B. M. Young Spend Time "Swapping Yarns."

Paso Robles, Cal., April 8.—Rear Admiral Evans had another good night and his condition this morning showed further improvement, but he has begun to realize that his complete recovery will be slow and that it will be necessary for him to remain here some time. That he has given up the idea of joining the fleet at San Diego is practically assured. Surgeon McDonald told him today that it would be very imprudent for him to leave the springs for San Diego, to which the patient replied:

"Well, doctor, I want to go very much, but will leave it with you."

"That settled it," said Dr. McDonald later. "The rear admiral will remain here until the fleet arrives at Monterey. Then, if everything progresses nicely, we will go aboard the Connecticut and the admiral will take the fleet through the Golden Gate. What we will do after that has not been decided upon."

When told that Mrs. Evans would arrive in Los Angeles and talk to him over the long distance telephone, the admiral was much pleased. **BILL INCREASES NAVAL STRENGTH**

Appropriation Measure Provides for Expenditure of \$22,000,000.

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Washington, April 8.—An enormous increase in Uncle Sam's naval force at an expenditure of \$22,522,500, is provided in the naval appropriation bill which was formally reported to the house today by the committee on naval affairs.

The measure provides for two battleships, costing \$4,000,000 each; 19 torpedo-boat destroyers at \$700,000 each; eight submarine torpedo-boats to be built at a total cost of \$3,500,000 and one sub-surface torpedo-boat at \$22,500,000. The bill also provides for the enlistment of 6,000 additional men to man the ships.

The program, while not as comprehensive as naval officials had looked for, is quite satisfactory. It had been hoped that four battleships, instead of two, would be provided for, but the provision for 19 torpedo-boat destroyers is considered in the nature of a compromise.

Congressman Richmond Pearson Hobson, who had championed a four-battleship program, and who, in a speech in the United States in a position to hold its own with any nation or nation on both oceans, is disappointed over the report, and it is not unlikely that he will attack it in another vigorous speech when it comes up for consideration.
