

ENGLAND IS GETTING ALARMED OVER THE IMPORTATION OF OUR HOPS.

FOR HONEST DEALINGS PORTLAND MERCHANTS ARE EVER IN THE LEAD.

NO MORE EGG SHIPMENTS FROM HERE TO THE NORTH UNLESS PAID FOR.

By Hyman H. Cohen. For some time the egg commission merchants have been determined to secure direct consignments from the producers of the Willamette valley which have ended disastrous for the local producer.

Much complaint has been registered by shippers regarding the returns for eggs from the north which are never what was expected, but in many instances the returns are not even made.

Of late with the larger supplies of eggs from the valley and on the demand from Alaska, the northern merchants have been offering from 10 to 15 cents more for the eggs than they were.

Returns have recently been received by some who shipped through this city and it was found that the actual returns were 10 to 15 cents less than those offered.

The practice of some of the larger handlers in the north of deducting for supposed interior quality has become a matter of concern to the local shippers.

It is believed that the local shippers will be able to secure a fair price for their eggs if the practice of deducting for interior quality is stopped.

Some wool is coming. Lower prices ruling both here and in Boston-Mohair sales.

A small amount of wool was received in the local markets during the past week and found a sale generally at lower prices than in the previous week.

The chittin bark season is on in a small way in the Pacific northwest and it is quite likely that a fair-sized peel will be secured.
